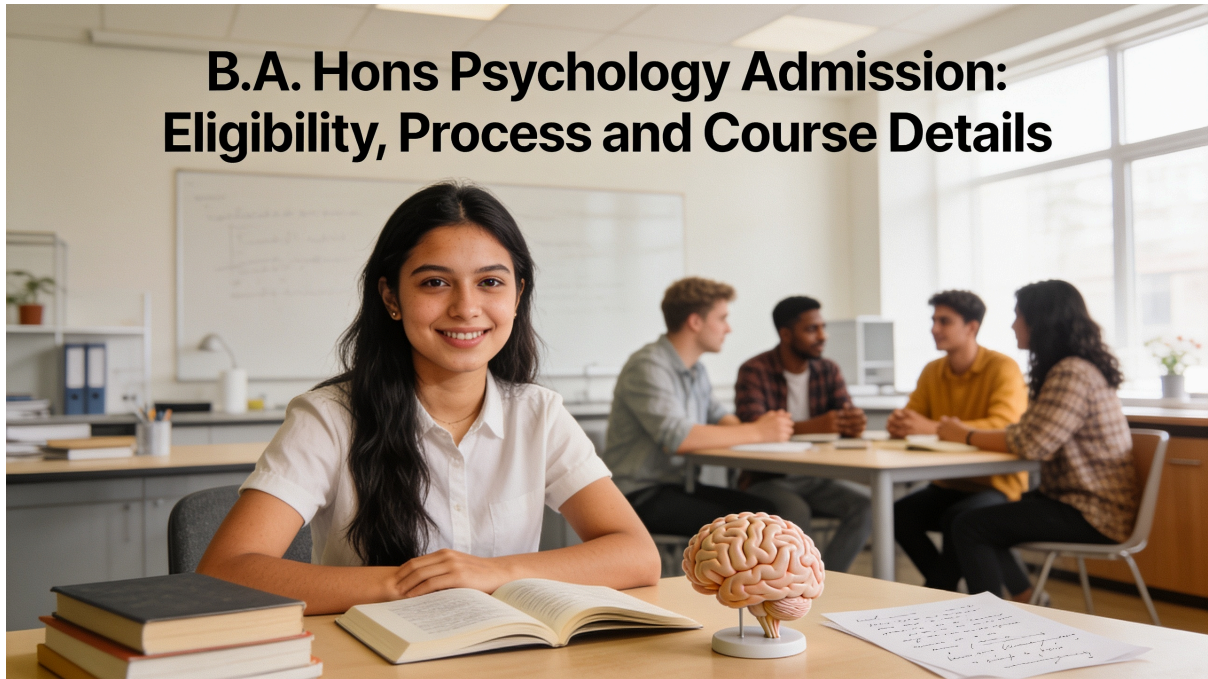


B.A. Hons Psychology Admission: Eligibility, Process and Course Details
